Well ... we have !! - Enrolled Pensioner Guard, Irishman Alexander Quinn:

- Served in the 80th, 78th, 31st & 95th Regiments for 24 years 1841-1864
- Saw action in the 1st Anglo Chinese War 1842, Battle of Ferozeshah 1845, 2nd Burma War (now Myanmar) 1852, Persian War 1856 & the defence & relief of Lucknow 1857 India
- Was wounded in the head at Burma 1853 and Bithon, India 1857
- Married three times, twice to widows, his last marriage ended badly, so badly she is not in his will
- Six children, four of whom sadly died before adulthood
- Arrived Fremantle on the Vimiera 1865 pictured here
- A warder in the Convict Establishment for nearly twenty years Gingin, Champion Bay, Greenough and Fremantle
- Quinny dies 1894 aged 71, said to be “a good and brave old soldier” see below
