

Joe Average. What was the average Enrolled Pensioner Guard (EPG) like? He:

- Was an Irishman, born 1818 who lived 62 years until 1880
- Enlisted aged 20, under 6 feet in height, served 17 years in the army being discharged as a Private
- Then received a pension for 25 years
- Fought in one or more wars of the British Empire and so “served overseas”
- Once here in WA he stayed or if he moved on, it was to South Australia
- Was married with children

Some EPG “fun facts”:

- Earliest born in 1787 was William Glasgow
- Youngest enlistment at 12 years old Irish lad John Childerhouse, he grew up to be a decorated 40th Regiment Sgt
- Longest lived at 95 years Englishman Robert Trett
- Longest length of service 29 years - Sgt James Taylor
- Tallest EPG at 6 feet 3 ½ inches was William Henry Shore (praise be his surname was not “Short”!!)
