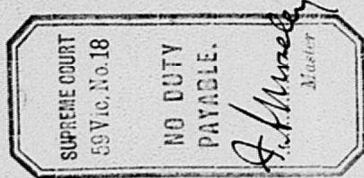

are held and firmly bound, unto Her Majesty Queen Victoria in the several sums following, (that is to say) the said *Alfred Constantine Mc Corry* in the sum of *Three hundred and fifty* pounds, the said *Neill Cameron* in the sum of *Three hundred and fifty* pounds, and the said *William Treacy*, in the sum of *Three hundred and fifty* pounds, of lawful British Money, current in the said Colony, to be paid to Her Majesty her heirs and Successors for which payment, to be well and truly made, we severally bind ourselves, and our several Heirs, Executors, and Administrators, firmly, by these presents. Sealed with our seals. Dated the *thirty first* day of *May* in the year of our Lord, on thousand eight hundred and *ninety eight*
